

VERNAL POND ECOLOGY AT HAROLD PARKER STATE FOREST

Barbara Buls, Interpreter for Harold Parker State Forest, has incorporated the knowledge she has gained from being a Cape Ann Vernal Pond Team member into her educational programs at Harold Parker. Harold Parker State Forest, in Andover, North Andover, North Reading and Middleton, comprises 3500 acres of forest and wetlands, with numerous vernal ponds. During the breeding season, she set up a vernal pond aquarium that housed wood frog tadpoles and fairy shrimp. Much of the summer, it served as a display in the Nature Center. Using the tank, she explained to many groups from area schools, YMCAs, summer camps, homeschoolers and drop-in visitors the importance of preserving vernal ponds in their natural state. This is particularly important in an area like Andover, where developers are clearing land and building new homes at an ever-increasing rate on property abutting the State Forest.

These visiting groups often request a nature walk in the forest, and on these occasions, Barbara takes them to some of the more easily accessible ponds along roadsides, where the children can find hundreds of tiny, first year wood frogs in the vicinity of the ponds. Upon viewing the ponds during their dry season, one can understand how development can take place with no thought to the ephemeral wetlands. Through these means, Barbara is spreading vernal pond ecology and preservation to the area around Harold Parker State Forest.
